

4 C CLIL Lesson Plan

Topic: ***Phenomenon „Civil War“ (introductory unit to US Civil War)***

Content (*What will I teach?*):

- Definition of term „civil war“ as opposed to other forms of armed conflicts
- Examples of civil wars
- Basic facts of American Civil War and Swiss Separate League War

Teaching aims (*What will they learn?*):

To enable learners to distinguish between the different types of armed conflicts within a state or between states, to explain the differences and illustrate them with historical examples

Learning outcomes

- *Learners know ...*
 - the main characteristics of a „civil war“
 - examples of civil wars in Europe of the 19th and 20th centuries
- *Learners are able ...*
 - to define the term „civil war“
 - name and place civil wars in Europe
 - interpret historical maps using the appropriate vocabulary
- *Learners are aware ...*
 - of the similarities between the two civil wars in the United States and Switzerland

Assessment

Can the learners ...

- list and place European civil wars according to historical era, causes and effects?
- „read“ and deduct historical information from maps?

Cognition (*What tasks will I develop to encourage higher order thinking?*):

- Comparing and classifying different types of war
- Classifying European civil wars
- Finding similarities between different civil war

Examples of cognition

- Differentiate between vocabulary pertaining to “war” and “civil war” in a word field
- Comparing maps
- Listing „civil wars“ according to criteria

Communication

Language of learning (vocabulary)

- Key vocabulary „war“ and „ending a war“

Language for learning (structures, functions)

- Picture and map position constructions

Culture/Community/Citizenship

Comparing differences and coincidences of two civil wars that led to first constitutions in both countries, however at significantly different death tolls.

Procedure

Step	<i>Social form/method/Questions</i>	<i>Resources</i>
“What’s in a name”: collecting examples of wars	Individually: “brain storming” of names of war on blackboard	
Sorting names according to causes: territorial, ideological, economical, religious	Pairs: using grid on blackboard supplied by teacher	
Assigning “war” and “conflict” words to respective type of war	Individually: word family tree	
Defining “Civil War”	Pairs: Internet research (printing out pictures)	T-Sheet form
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Discussing graphs • Discussing pictures 	Pairs: Mini Pyramid Discussion (½ form graph, ½ form picture)	
Presentation of results	Sheets pinned on board: Explaining selected graphs/describing selected pictures
